# **Electrical Plant Area Access**

### Who needs to read this?

All Curtin University Electrical Access Authorising Staff, Electrical Contractors and Electrical Consultants who require access to electrical plant areas.

#### Background

Electrical Contractor's Licenses have been stored in Rapid Global and Curtin will begin to start storing Electrical Workers Licenses and supporting documentation for all Electrical Contractor inductees where access to plant areas will be required.

#### Information

All electrical contractor inductees will receive a notification from Rapid Global to log in and complete an online form.

Where you require access or keys to plant areas you will be requested to upload your Electrical Licence, and/ or Employee Letter/Capability Statement, and/ or where applicable a HV Switching Certificate.

On the following page you will find an example of what is required for the employer letter.

Once the online form is completed and verified by Curtin Electrical Team you will be required to collect a sticker (or stickers if also seeking HV access) for your contractor card. The sticker can be collected from Building 109, 115 or 502B.

Please note that not all Electrical Contractors require access to these areas and therefore are required to select 'no' in the online form.

Where access is required you will still need to complete the Site Access Authority form.

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## Employee Letter / Capability Statement Example

To Curtin Health and Safety,
