<b>Articles and book chapters</b>	OK - covered under Statutory licence. Must arrange access through <a href="#">Reading Lists</a> . Requires strict limits (10%/one chapter, etc.) and <a href="#">electronic warning notice</a> .	OK to copy a reasonable portion (10%/one chapter, one article per issue, etc). May be OK to copy more if no commercial harm (e.g. out of print titles).	OK to provide link to content. If you must make a copy, seek permission from the copyright owner.
<b>Creative Commons and other Open Licences</b>	OK - must comply with terms of licence, for example: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>SA (Share Alike) - if you adapt the material, you must attach the same licence as the original work</li> <li>ND (No Derivatives) - adaptations are not permitted</li> </ul>	OK to copy.	OK - must comply with terms of licence, for example: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>SA (Share Alike) - if you adapt the material, you must attach the same licence as the original work</li> <li>ND (No Derivatives) - adaptations are not permitted</li> </ul>
<b>Images, artworks, diagrams, etc.</b>	OK if: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>From online website.</li> <li>Graphic has accompanying text which is also to be copied.</li> <li>If artwork has not been separately published.</li> </ul> Need to include <a href="#">electronic warning notice</a>	OK to copy entire graphic. Limit to a single copy.	You need to seek permission from the copyright owner, unless: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Website terms of use permit your proposed usage.</li> <li>The graphic is in the public domain.</li> <li>The graphic is made available under an open licence (like Creative Commons).</li> </ul>
<b>Library Databases (incl. ebooks and ejournals)</b>	OK – arrange access through Library <a href="#">Reading Lists</a> .	Usually OK for your own use.	OK to link to content. If you must include a copy ask Library to check licence terms.
<b>MOOC content (e.g. edX)</b>	OK to link to or embed the content. Check MOOC licence terms for permitted/prohibited uses.	OK to copy reasonable amount.	OK to link to or embed the content. Check licence terms for permitted/prohibited uses.
<b>Music</b>	OK to provide via Blackboard or in iLecture under the Music Licence. Need to include <a href="#">prescribed notice and information</a> about musical work.	OK to copy reasonable amount.	OK to provide link to content or use if permitted by website terms of use. Otherwise, seek permission from copyright owner.
<b>OERs (Open Educational Resources)</b>	OK to link to or embed the content. Check OER licence terms for permitted/prohibited uses. Always acknowledge source.	OK to copy reasonable amount.	OK to link to or embed the content. Check licence terms for permitted/prohibited uses. Always acknowledge source.

<b>Social media (user-generated content)</b>	OK to link to or embed the content. Check website terms of use for prohibited/permited uses. Must acknowledge source.	OK to copy reasonable amount.	OK to link to or embed the content. Check website terms of use for prohibited/permited uses – often necessary to seek permission. Must acknowledge source.
<b>Software</b>	Check licence terms of use for permitted/prohibited uses. Copying of software manuals may be permitted by licence OR may be copied under statutory licence - requires strict limits (e.g. 10%) and <a href="#">electronic warning notice</a>	Check licence terms of use.	Check licence terms of use – often necessary to seek permission from copyright owner.
<b>Text quotations and excerpts</b>	Usually OK to copy 1-2 pages (or 1% of words) under the statutory licence. OK to post to Blackboard without using <a href="#">Reading Lists</a> .	OK to copy.	OK to use short, acknowledged quotations. OK to reproduce short extracts for criticism or review.
<b>TV or Radio Broadcast programs</b>	OK to show in class or provide via Blackboard/iLecture Screenrights statutory licence. Need to include <a href="#">electronic warning notice</a> .	OK to make recording.	Provide link to or embed the content only (ABC, SBS, etc.). May not copy recording without permission.
<b>Video</b> - <b>Commercial DVDs</b>	OK to show in class. Generally unable to record video in iLecture or post copy to Blackboard. May be OK to incorporate short excerpts in iLecture.	May be OK to copy short excerpts.	Need to seek permission from copyright owner.
<b>Video</b> - <b>YouTube</b>	OK to show in class. OK to link to or embed the content in Blackboard. May be OK to incorporate short excerpts into iLecture (but not full video). Only provide access to YouTube videos from authorised sources.	Making copies of content not permitted by terms of use.	OK to link to or embed the content. Making copies of content not permitted by terms of use.
<b>Websites</b>	OK to link to content. Check website terms of use for prohibited/permited uses. OK to copy text/graphic works and include on Blackboard under statutory licences. For large amounts of text, arrange through Library <a href="#">Reading Lists</a> .	Check website terms of use – usually OK to make copy for personal use.	OK to link to content. Check website terms of use for prohibited/permited uses. Usually necessary to seek permission from copyright owner.
