Study online

General English and English Language Bridging are available to study online from the comfort of your home.

Curtin English Scholarship

If you graduate from Curtin English and progress to study an undergraduate or postgraduate course at Curtin University, you will receive up to AUD\$6,780 towards your university tuition.

The scholarship is available to all international students who have received an offer to study at Curtin's Perth campus, which is conditional on meeting the required standard of English. See page 11 for more information.







Curtin English courses

Curtin English delivers a number of courses to help improve your English skills for entry to Curtin University or Curtin College.

Find your Curtin English pathway

This diagram shows the English language courses offered by Curtin University and the various pathways that are tailored to suit your needs.



The English course you need to take will be determined by your English language test result. Some of the English language test results accepted by Curtin English are:

- International English Language Testing System (IELTS) (General or Academic)
- Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL)
- Pearson Test of English Academic (PTE-A).

Password test

If you don't have a recent English language test result, you will need to complete the Password test. This is an online language test provided free of charge by Curtin English to determine your English starting level. Your score can be used for entry into all Curtin English courses. Some students may be required to take follow-up assessments.

Curtin English courses

General English

General English is suitable for students with elementary to intermediate English levels (overall IELTS score from 3.0 to 5.0 or equivalent). It will develop your language skills in preparation for academic study and build your confidence in using English in different environments. Passing General English will qualify you to move on to Gateway English.

If your overall IELTS score is lower than IELTS 3.0, please contact Curtin English to discuss your study opportunities.

Gateway English


The Gateway English program is for students with upper intermediate English levels (overall IELTS score from 5.0 or equivalent). It prepares you to meet the entry requirements for the English Language Bridging program or Curtin College.

English Language Bridging program

The English Language Bridging (ELB) program satisfies the English language requirement for Curtin University courses. It is an accelerated academic English program that offers a direct pathway into Curtin.

ELB is available to study in-person at our Perth campus or online from your home country.

Eligible for Curtin English Scholarship



This course will ensure you develop a strong foundation in English and set you on the right path to academic success.

Delivered in partnership with Navitas English, you will learn general English and other language skills that you can use in everyday situations, such as at work, at university or in social settings.

You will attend classes at Navitas' English centre in Perth city, and learn alongside students from diverse backgrounds, ensuring you gain a multicultural study experience. You will be tested and assessed on your listening, speaking, reading, writing and grammar.

Admission criteria

This course comprises two General English levels. To enter General English 1, you need an overall IELTS score of 3.0 or equivalent. To enter General English 2, you need an overall IELTS score of 4.0 or equivalent.

Successful completion of General English 1 will allow you to gain entry to General English 2. On successfully completing General English 2, you will transfer to the Gateway Program at Curtin's Perth campus, where you will develop your language skills at a higher level.

Gateway English

This course is ideal for international students. It aims to develop your English language and independent study skills to a level where you can apply for entry to the English Language Bridging program or Curtin College courses.

You will practise your skills in reading, writing, listening and speaking, and improve your grammar and vocabulary for general and academic situations. You will also learn useful study management strategies to prepare you for academic studies.

The course content will help you settle into university and develop your understanding of contemporary issues and ideas.

Gateway English duration

Gateway English takes six to 24 weeks. Your course duration will depend on your current English level and the English language requirement you need to enter the English Language Bridging program, or your Curtin College course.

There are four possible course durations:

- 6 weeks (Gateway English 1)
- 12 weeks (Gateway English 2)
- 18 weeks (Gateway English 3)
- 24 weeks (Gateway English 4).

Your Curtin English offer letter will state what grade you need to achieve in Gateway English to progress to the next stage of your studies.

English Language Bridging program

The English Language Bridging (ELB) program, which can be studied face-to-face in Perth or online*, is one of the most popular courses at Curtin English and prepares you for direct entry into Curtin University.

It will help you develop the English language proficiency, academic literacy and study skills you'll need for your chosen Curtin course.

You will also be prepared to study at Curtin by learning how to read and understand a Curtin course outline and use Curtin's online learning platforms.

In addition, you can complement your studies with a social program and practise your English skills outside the classroom.

ELB programs

Depending on your current level of English and the level required for entry to your Curtin course, you can undertake the 17-week, 10-week, nine-week or two-week ELB program.

17-week ELB program

This program is divided into two blocks: Block 1 (nine weeks) and Block 2 (eight weeks). In your first week you will prepare for the academic and social aspects of studying at Curtin University and how to deal with life in Australia as an international student.

Throughout Block 1 and 2, you will develop your English proficiency, academic literacy and study skills. This means that while you develop your reading, writing, listening and speaking skills, you will also learn how to:

- plan and structure a piece of academic writing
- refer to sources in your writing and speaking
- take notes while listening
- make academic presentations
- take an active part in seminar discussions
- think critically and apply that to your studies
- study independently and manage your time
- research and evaluate texts.

Students entering the 17-week program from Gateway English do not need to complete the first week of the ELB program.

Admission criteria

A minimum overall IELTS score of 5.5 or equivalent, with a minimum of 5.0 in each subskill. If you have a higher English requirement for your Curtin University course, you will need a higher score to enter this program.

Nine-week ELB program

The nine-week program is Block 1 of the 17-week program.

It is designed for students planning to study an undergraduate or postgraduate course at Curtin University with a requirement of IELTS 6.0 or equivalent.

Admission criteria

A minimum overall IELTS score of 5.5 or equivalent, with a minimum of 5.0 in each subskill. If you have a higher English requirement for your Curtin University course, you will need a higher score to enter this program.

10-week ELB program

In the first two weeks of the 10-week program, you will be introduced to academic literacy, prepare for the academic and social aspects of studying at Curtin and begin the transition to life in Australia.

In the following eight weeks you will join block 2 of the 17-week program.

Admission criteria

A minimum overall IELTS score of 6.0 overall or equivalent, with a minimum of 5.5 in each subskill. If you have a higher English requirement for your Curtin University course, you will need a higher score to enter this program.

Two-week ELB program

This program is for students who have achieved the required overall score for entry to their chosen Curtin course, but have not met the required score in one of the subskills.

Course content is tailored to your individual needs and focuses on improving your English abilities in the relevant subskill area.

Admission criteria

You must have met the overall English language score required for entry to your Curtin University course, with one subskill score no more than 0.5 IELTS (or equivalent) below the minimum score required. The required score for your sub-skill can be 6.0 or 6.5.

Receive up to A\$6,780 credit toward a Curtin University course!

When you complete a Curtin English program and transition to a Curtin University course, you could receive up to \$6,780 toward your university tuition, with the Curtin English Scholarship.

How it works

Your credit will be available after you complete the first semester of your undergraduate or postgraduate course and will be applied after the census date. The total amount will equal what you spent on your English tuition fees up to the value of A\$6,780.

Who's eligible

- All international students studying Gateway and/or ELB as a pathway to Curtin University
- Students who complete their studies either in-person or online.

No need to apply

You don't need to apply for the Curtin English Scholarship. You'll find out if you're eligible when you receive your conditional offer from Curtin. From there, you'll simply need to accept your conditional offer and start your Curtin English course.

Customised programs

Curtin English can design custom English programs for current university students and specific international groups, such as young people, high school students, women or business professionals. They are designed to improve your English language skills alongside your peers, while experiencing Australian culture.

Programs can incorporate English language classes for a range of levels, as well as cultural activities, Perth sightseeing, university guest lectures, workshops and specialised excursions.

English classes can be conducted independently or integrated into an existing Curtin English course. Customised programs can be run at any time of the year with flexible durations and can include accommodation if required.

Customised program types

Curtin study tour

Curtin study tours combine English language study with a variety of fun activities and cultural excursions to places around Perth, such Rottnest Island, Fremantle and Kings Park.

English for specific purposes

This program combines English language classes with workshops, guest lectures, seminars and excursions related to your group's field of study.




KALGOORLIE



St Catherine's College

Rent includes meals and academic support that is tailored to suit the different stages of your university journey, such as free tutoring and formal academic dinners. UniLodge

Vickery House


