Are you a problem solver who is open to working with a team to come up with a solution?

If this describes you – consider being a Health and Safety Representative (HSR). Work Health and Safety is integral to working at Curtin University, and HSRs are a vital piece of the program.

With the support of the Health and Safety Team, HSRs help make sure that our workplaces, as far as practicable, do not expose workers to hazards and risks – gaining skills and experience along the way.

Being a Health and Safety Representative entitles you to:

- Attend a 5-day introductory training course in Health and Safety (can now be split over two weeks – 3 and 2 days).
- Receive a weekly allowance paid to HSRs for their services as per the Curtin University Enterprise Agreement.
- Support in your role from the Health and Safety Department and your line manager
- The opportunity to gain extra knowledge and expertise in your field, local projects and initiatives of the University and more.

Eligibility Requirements

- Work in the area/ workgroup that you wish to represent.
- Be willing to attend Health and Safety Committee Meetings.
- Be willing to attend/participate in HSR training and knowledge sharing sessions arranged by the Health and Safety team throughout the year.
- A passion for safety and health with a curious mind.

What's Involved

- Liaising with workers in your workgroup – consultation.
- Keeping up to date with H&S information.
- Facilitating issue resolution.
- Being part of the Health and Safety Committees.
- Completing workplace inspections of the areas you represent.
- Participating in investigations of incidents should they occur.
