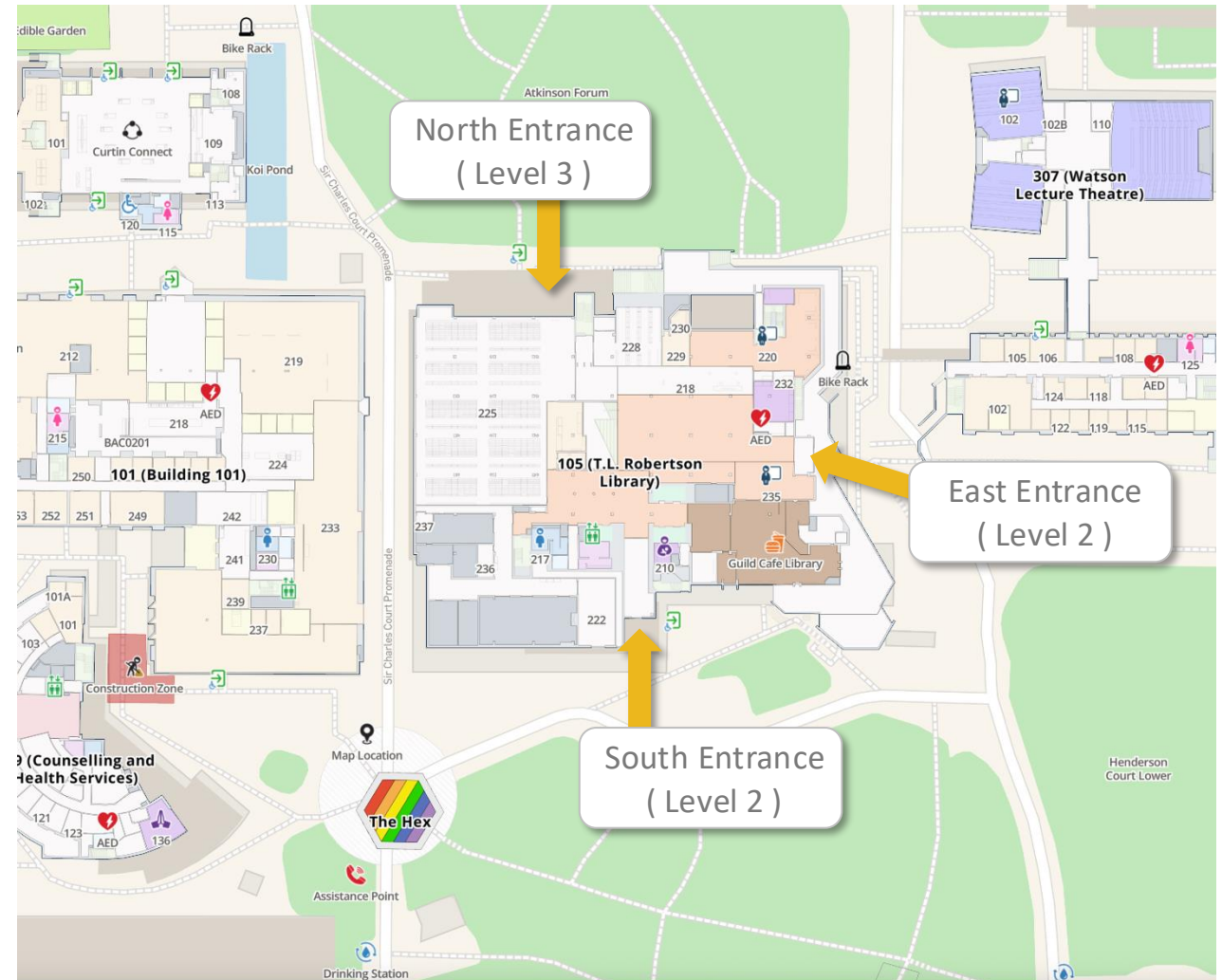

There are lifts available on Levels 2 to 7.

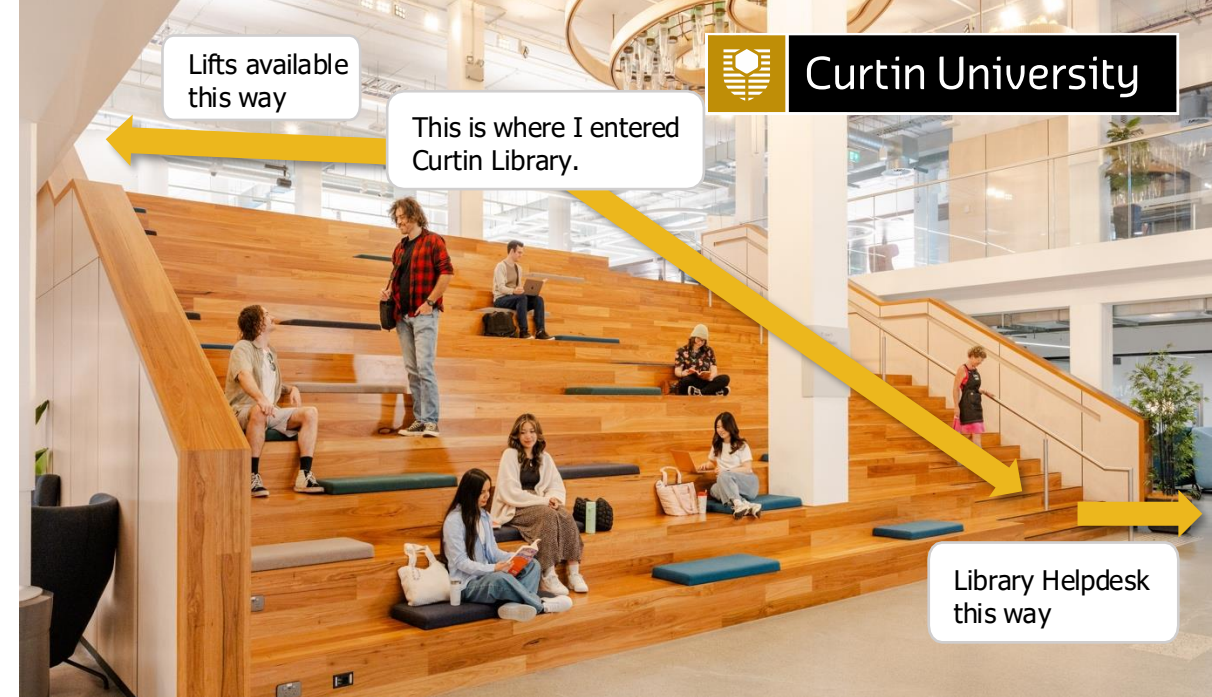


Finding the Library Help Desk

There are seats near the Help Desk where I can take a quiet moment if I need to.

labelled "Library Staff"

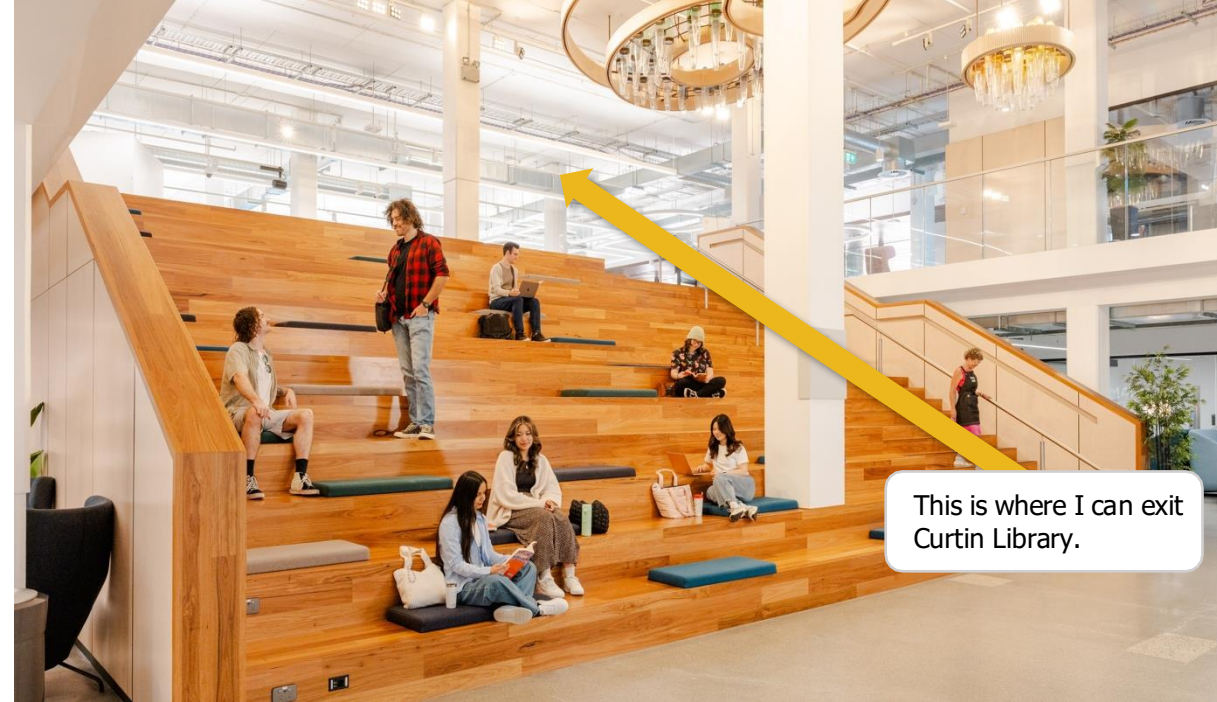


Exiting Curtin Library
