English competency for undergraduate degrees

You can meet this criterion in any one of the following ways:

- ATAR English/English Literature/EALD, scaled score of 50
- STAT Written English, score 140
- English General Grade A (portfolio entry only)
- A qualification listed at curtin.edu/englishrequirements
- Completing a UniReady or Indigenous Enabling Program.

English competency for UniReady and First Nations enabling programs

You need to meet all of the following criteria:

- A spoken English level where you can comfortably converse in English in the classroom setting.
- A reading English level where you can readily comprehend an Australian newspaper article.
- A written English level where you can produce a comprehensible paragraph of text about a topic with mostly correct grammar and punctuation.
